BUDAPEST-The Hungarian government announced last night that it had arrested Israel Jacobson, American Jewish welfare worker on "suspicion of spying against the Hungarian state." Jacobson, who is director of the Hungarian-Americara joint distribution committee, was arrested a week ago after returning here from leave in the United States.

The Board unanimously ruled that the Interrutional Typographical Union had violated the Taft-Hartley Act in Baltimore.
