Use of Rule 26 Helps Make Contract

Here is another sample of the Rule of 26—considering your partner's cards and your own as a single unit.

Holding a weak hand, containing only one ace and one king, Mr. Dale nevertheless bid the slam in diamonds after hearing his partner's second round bid of three no trump.

Mr. Muzzy would have missed this slam if he had held the North cards. He would not have realized the strength of his hand in relation to his partner's bidding. He is more likely to reach the six level in those cases where he himself holds a huge hand—and regardless of whether he gets much support in the bidding from his partner.

Mr. Dale, however, had the imagination to picture Mr. Masters' holding just about as it was. He realized his king of diamonds could probably be used to ruff clubs, his ace of hearts represented a fourth winner and his ten, nine of spades might have a direct bearing on a fifth winner. He was quite right and Mr. Masters brought home the slam by good timing of the play.

Mr. Meek opened the queen of hearts which was taken with the king. Mr. Masters cashed two diamonds, then led to the ace of hearts, returned a heart and ruffed it.

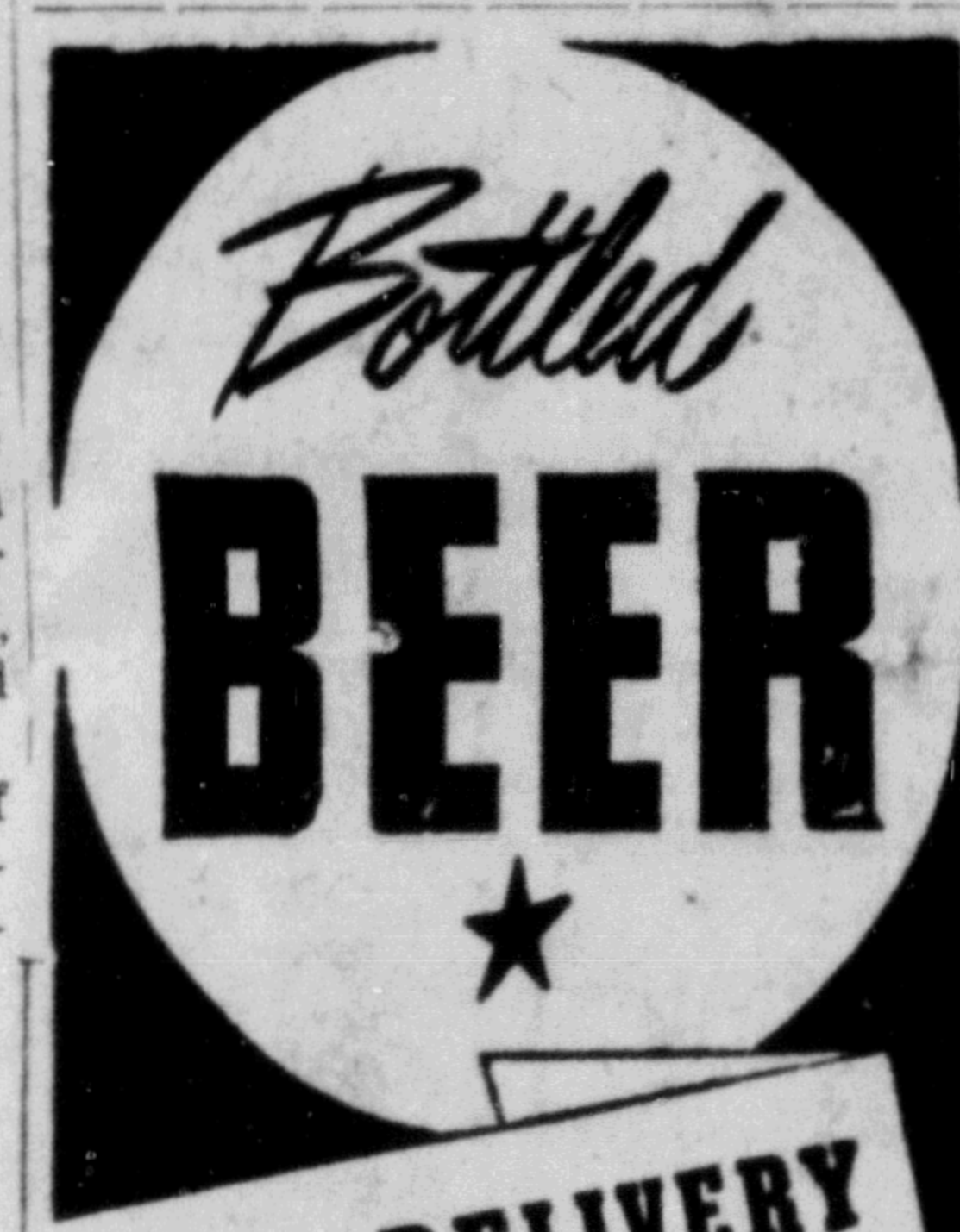
He played the ace of clubs and ruffed the ten of clubs on

the board. Another heart was ruffed in the closed hand and the queen of clubs was ruffed in the dummy.

At this stage, both closed hand and dummy had left three spades and a trump. The ten of spades was led from the board and it made no difference where the king and queen of the suit were placed. The ten was ducked and Mr. Meek won with the queen. A spade return, would have gone into the ace, jack. On the actual club return, dummy ruffed while Mr. Masters discarded his jack of spades.

Outstanding Community Worker

He was either a director or member of dozens of other organizations and hospital boards and among recognitions of his merit was his appointment as Swedish Consul for B.C. on May 21, 1920.

For years Olof Hanson was the outstanding figure in the commercial and industrial life of B.C. and by 1925 was recognized as the lumber king of this part of the province. He had risen from a penniless immigrant to a rich man.

Always active, he strove at all times to move ahead. Nothing was too hard for him and he undertook many contracts for timber that appeared impossible.

He was elected Liberal MP for Skeena in the general election in 1936 and re-elected in 1935 and 1940. He served his constituency faithfully.

Mr. Hanson was a charter member of the Omicron Masonic Lodge of Smithers and of Tye Lodge and Valhalla Lodge in Prince Rupert. He was a member of the Lutheran Church.

Besides his wife and daughter, he leaves a brother, Jack, in Smithers, and three sisters in Sweden.

Judge W. O. Fulton of Prince Rupert, friend of Mr. Hanson's for the past 40 years, left at midnight for Vancouver to serve as one of the pallbearers at the funeral on Monday.

Out of respect of the death of the immigrant boy who rose to the top the hard way, the office of Dybvad and Hanson will be closed on Monday.

Mr. Hanson's sustained effort and faith in building British Columbia will long be remembered. Prince Rupert has lost a great citizen.
