Cafe Downs Motors 4-3 In Second Half Rally

Sparked by Frankie Ansalmo, who scored a hat trick in the second half of a raggedly-played Prince Rupert Football league game at Roosevelt Park last night, Gonodla Cafe roared back to defeat General Motors 4-3.

Adrian Tambourini opened the first half scoring for the cafe

eleven, making sure of a penalty shot awarded Gondola by referee Pat Forman.

Ed Rutten, speedy Motors winger, tied up the game about 15 minutes before the end of the first half, booting the ball into the goal while Gondola net-minder G. Viteri fumbled the ball. Five minutes later Rutten tallied again, on a run in notching the ball into the far side of the net well out of Viteri's reach.

Down 2-1 going into the second half and taking advantage of a disorganized Motors squad, Frank Ansalmo collected the ball from a goal mouth scramble and blasted it goalwards. Motors custodian Frank Rutten never had a chance as the ball hit the goal post and bounced in.

A few minutes later Ansalmo again found himself in the clear and drove home a shot that Rutten never got his hands on. Again about five minutes after Ansalmo, who at half time was going to quit the game because of alleged indignities, got a pass from Egedio Nordio and once more beat Rutten to the draw.

Four minutes before the end of play, Viteri's inability to understand the rules protecting a goaltender, dropped the ball after a Motors rush, and in the scramble that ensued Ernie Kreutsky booted in GM's third goal.

The league executive meeting, scheduled to hear a Gondola Cafe protest, was postponed until 7:30 Friday, at Annunciation school. No local 708 representatives were present to make a quorum.

Little League Names Umps

Tentative candidates for umpiring duties for the Little League were suggested at a meeting of the Little League Association last night at the Civic Centre.

Eight names were suggested, and each of the nominees will be asked if they are willing to undertake the task. Proposed were Benny Windie, Johnny Comadina, A. Letourneau, Don Scherk, Steve Mintenko, Bill Sundberg, Ken Warren and Ralph Endridge. Only one of the eight, Steve Mintenko, was present at the meeting. He asserted that he would take on the arbitrating duties. The candidates named would be required for plate umpiring only.

The meeting also learned that equipment for the farm teams was now on hand and that distribution will be directed by Ralph Pay.

The question of coaches for the farm teams was discussed and Bob Bone of the Canadian Legion stated he estimated that between eight and 10 Legion members would be available for coaching duties. It was the general feeling of the meeting that four coaches would be assigned to each farm team.

The meeting defined ground rules for Algoma Park as follows:

A ground ball hit between the bridge and a post which is to be set up on a rough arc, 180 feet from home plate, will be a three-base hit. A ball hit to the left of the bridge on the ground was ruled a two-base hit, as was a ground ball hit to the right of the post.

A fly ball that is not caught, and does not touch the ground before clearing the 180-foot line between the post and the bridge was ruled an automatic home run.

A fly ball out to right field which cleared the natural ground hazard, and to the right of the post, was ruled as a two-base hit. Distance from home plate to the hazard along the first base line is 140 feet, as measured by League officials.

A practice of the Super-Valu farm team has been scheduled for 7 p.m. tomorrow night at Gyro Park, coach Danny Johnston said today.

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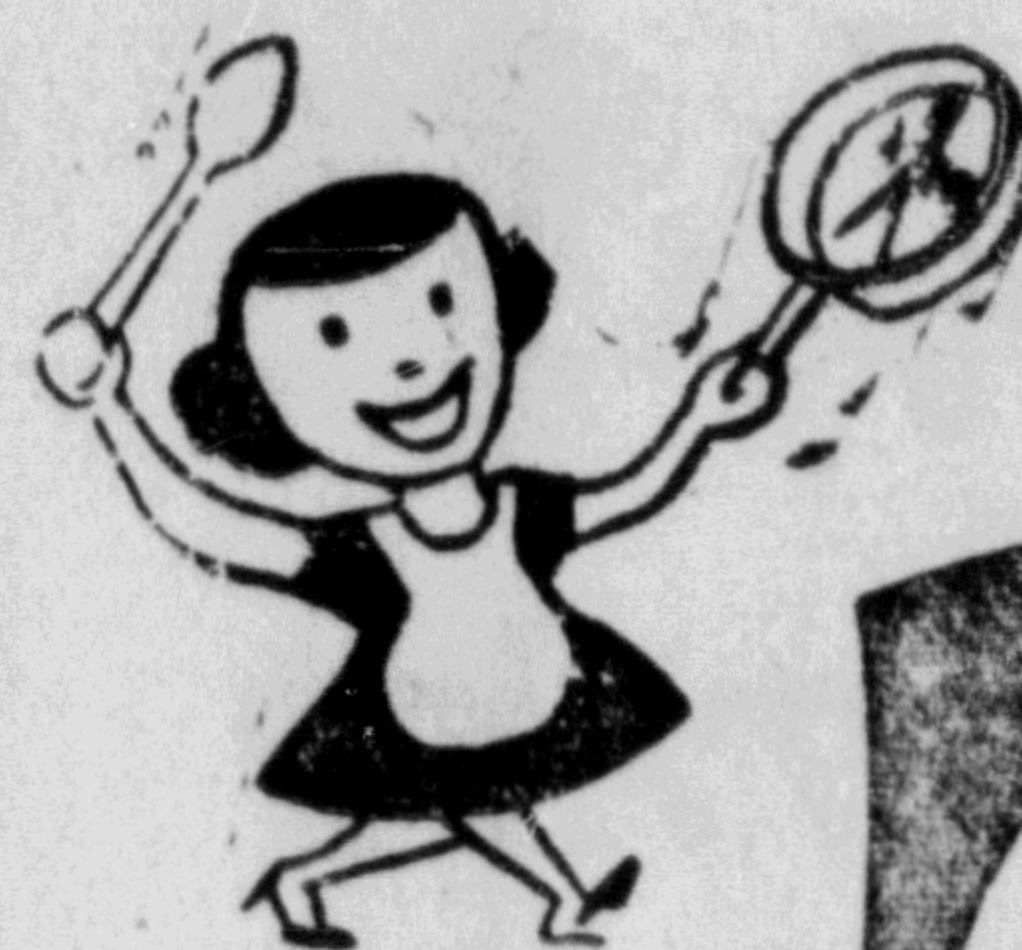
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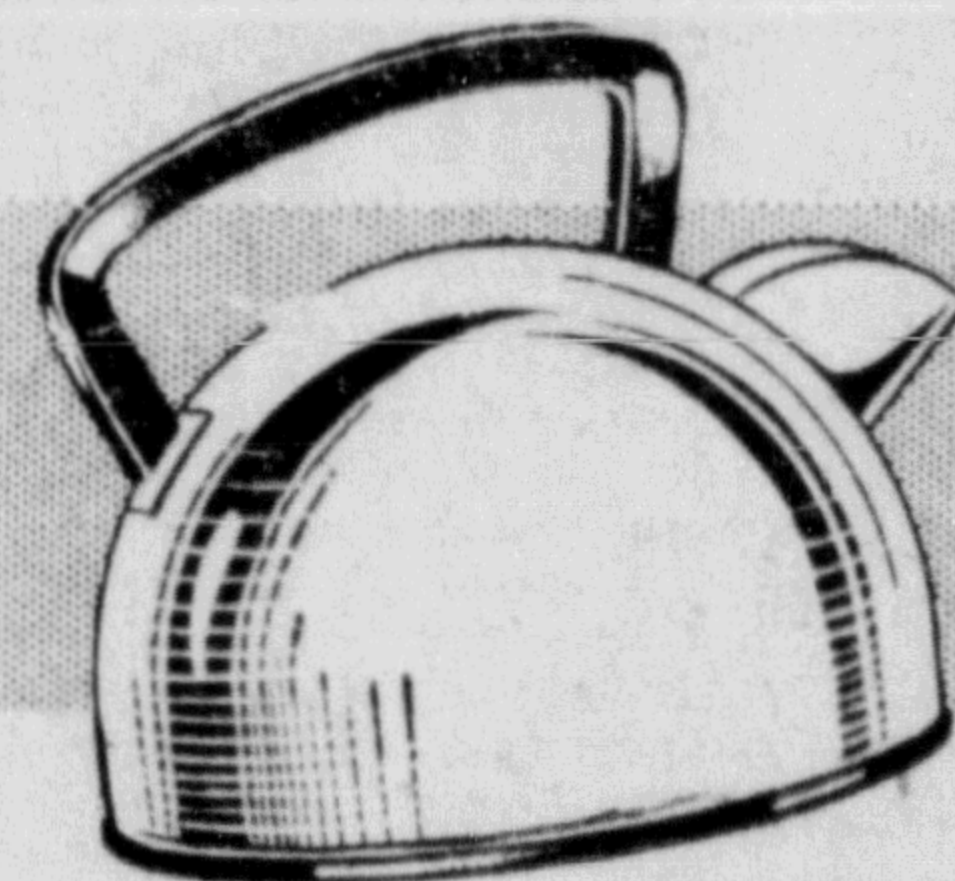
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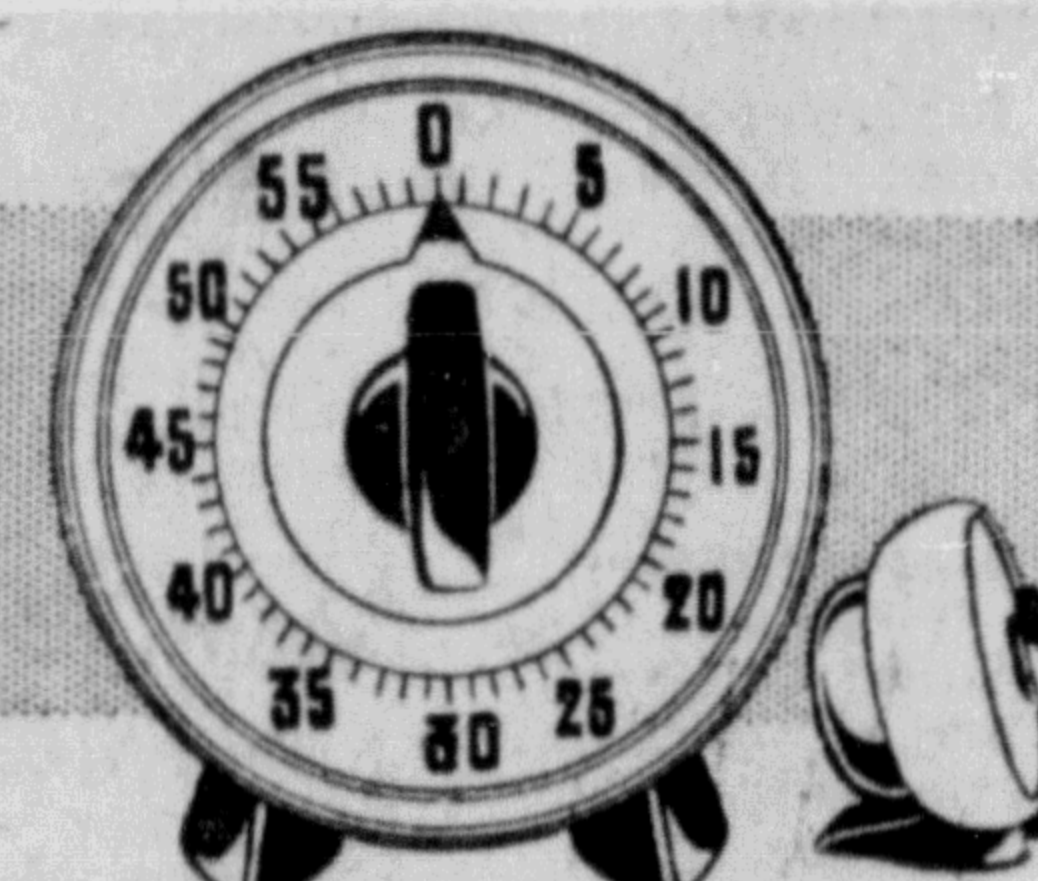
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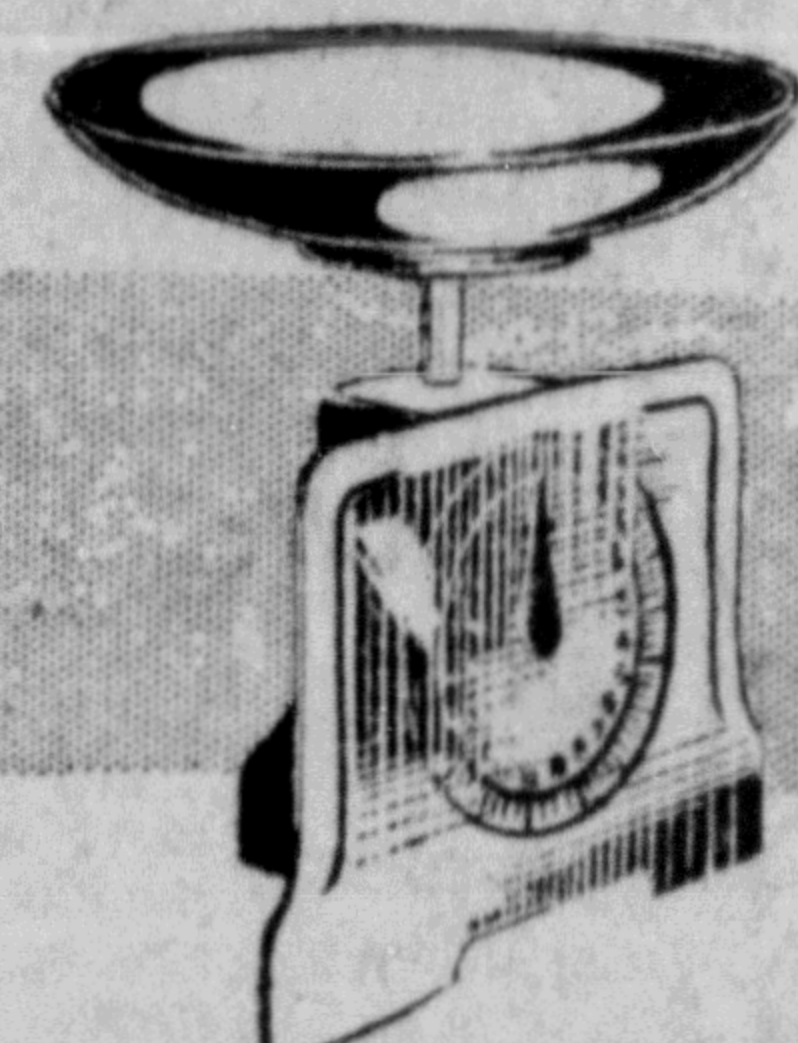
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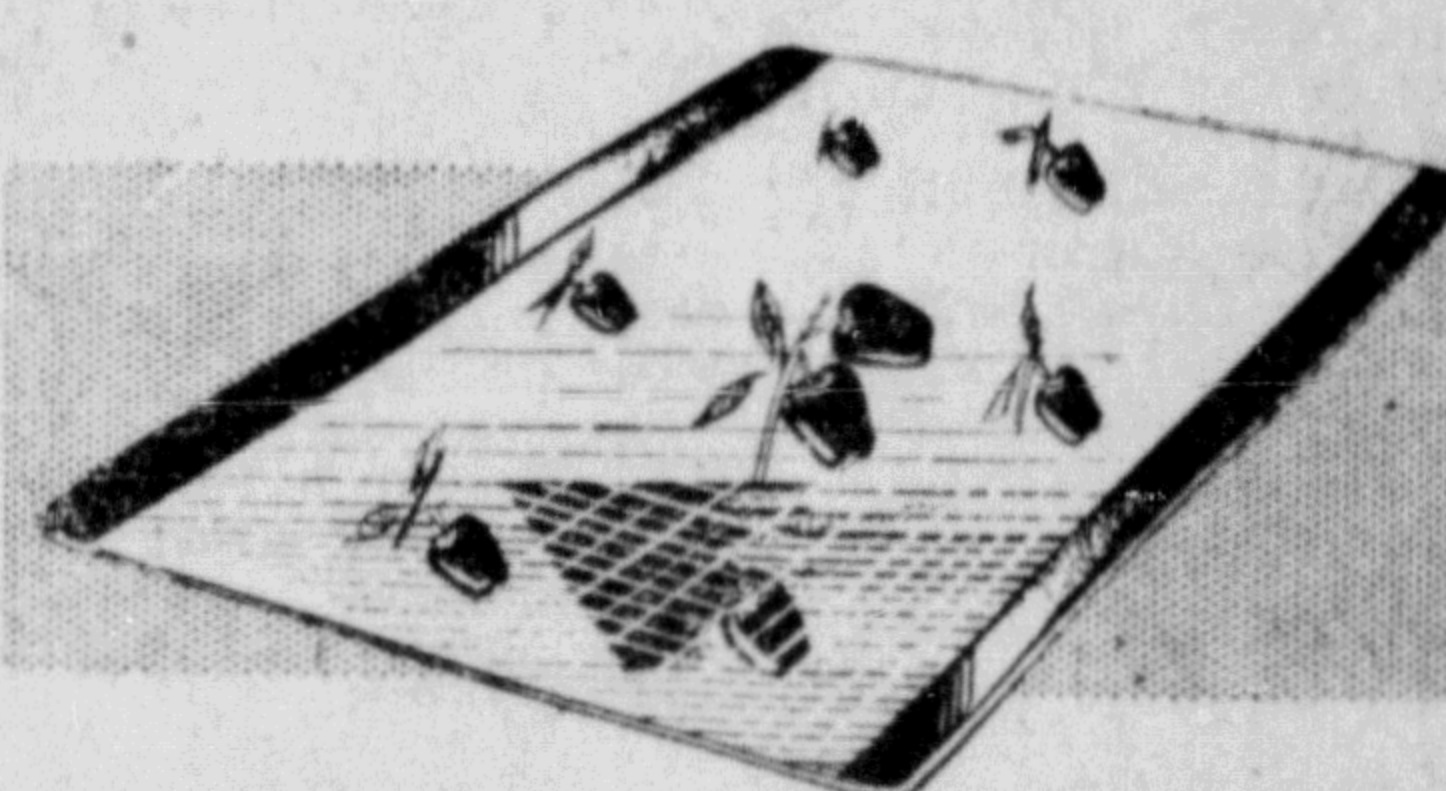
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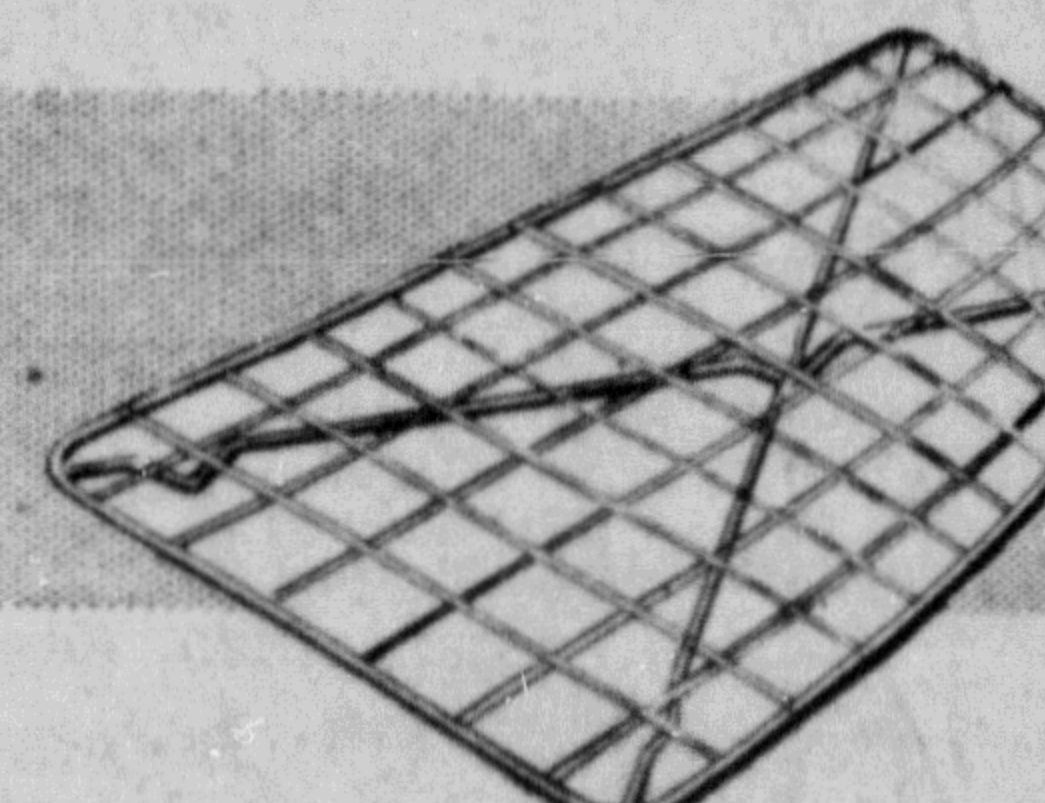
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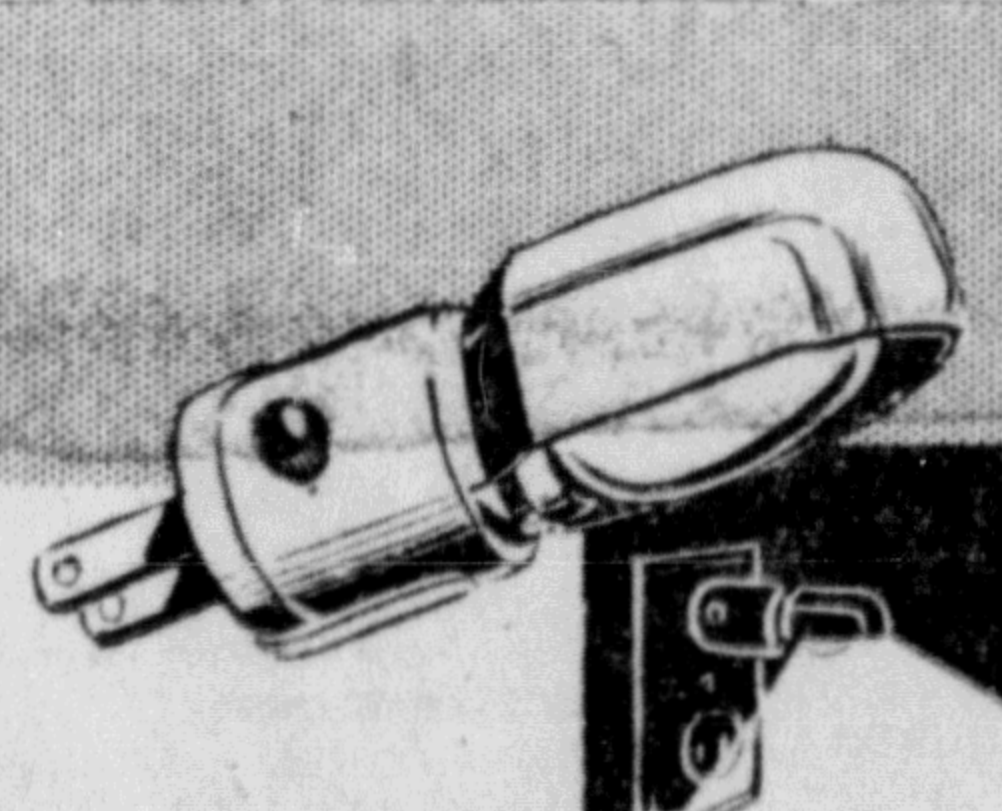
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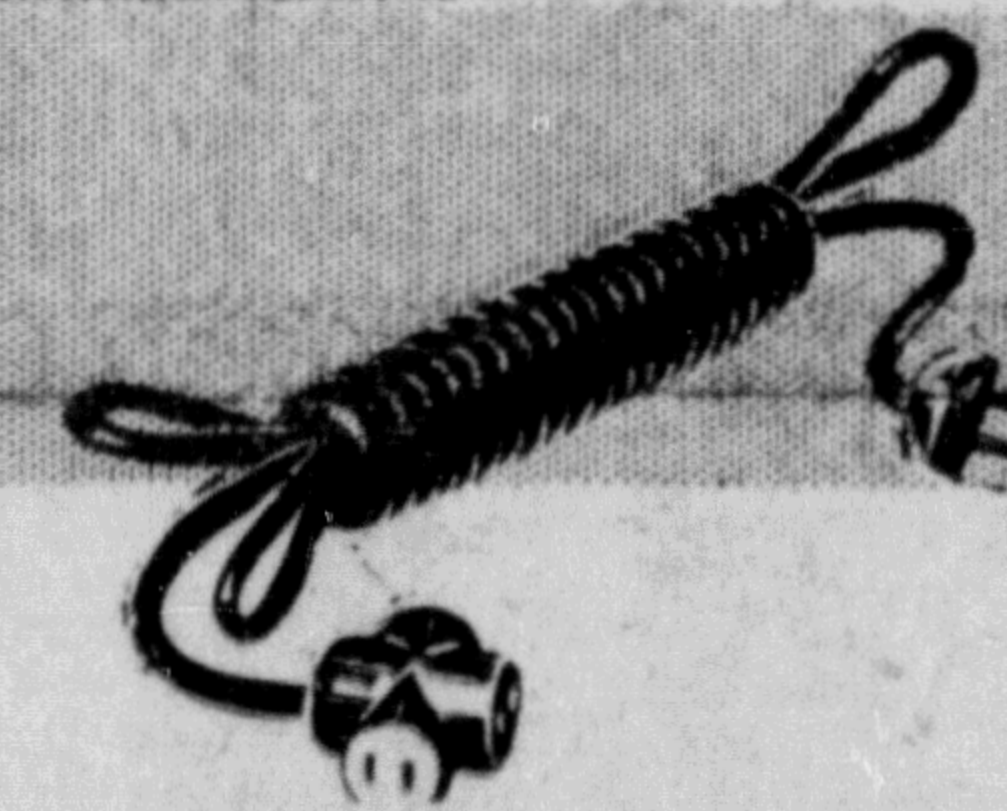
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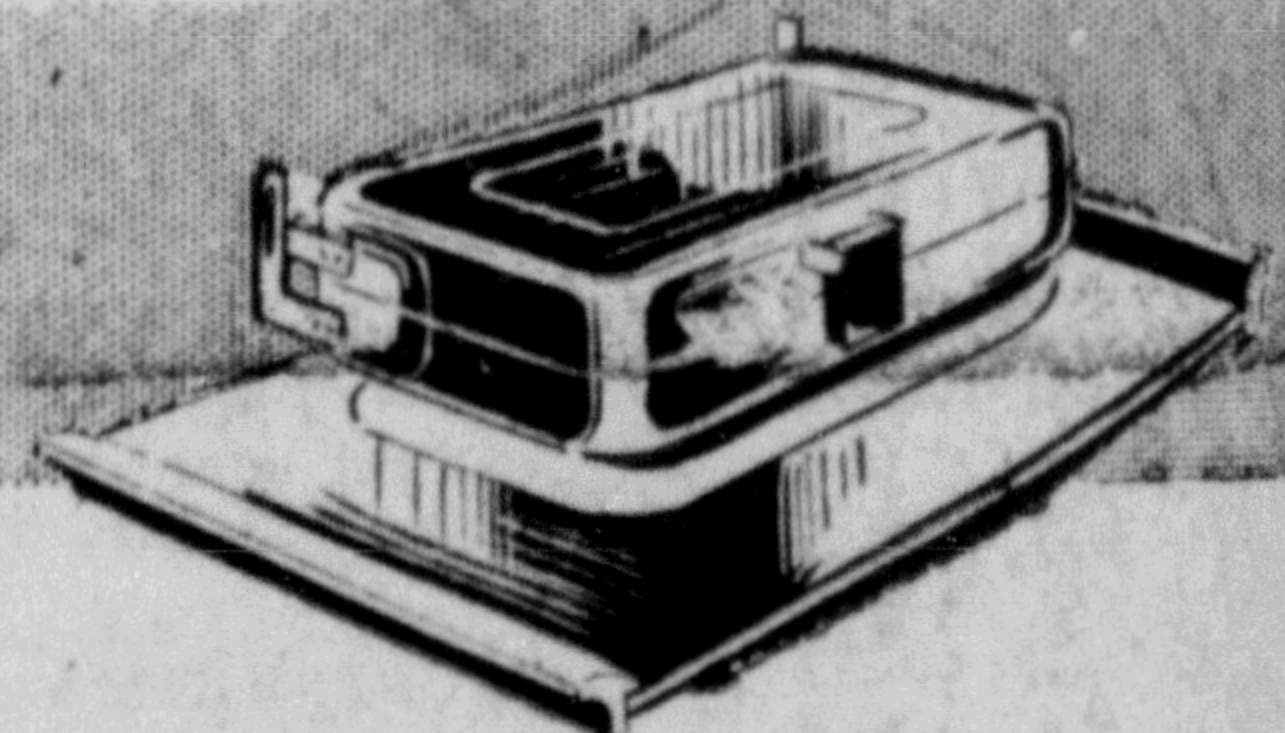
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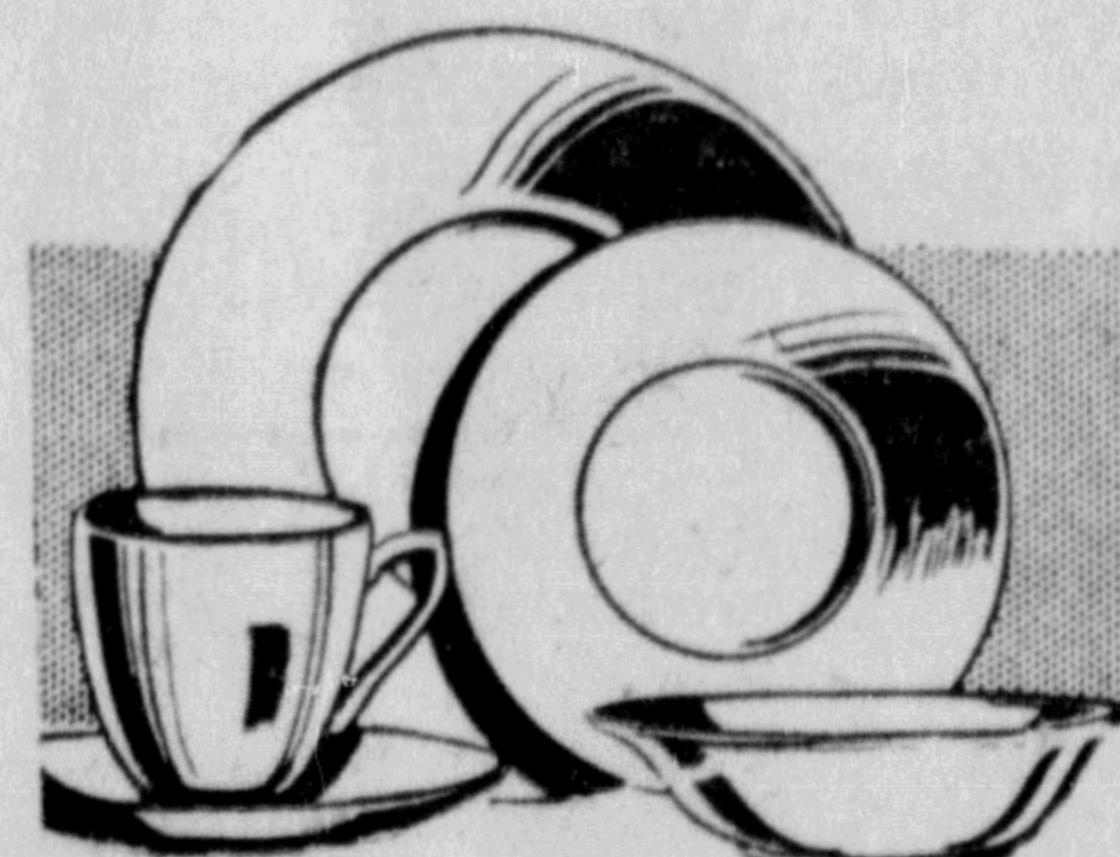
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
