Weighty affairs it seems were discussed between these representatives of great powers, and it is claimed that an attempt was actually made on the part of the Kaiser to undermine the triple entente cordiale and on the part of the Kaiser the

Lost

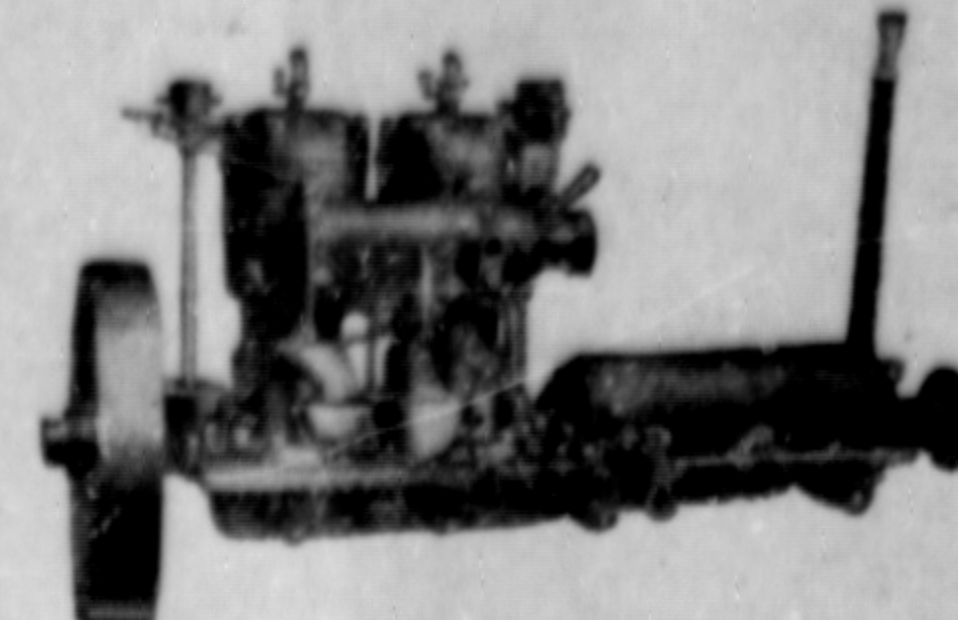
