Cost of living still soars, according to the latest estimate of the Department of Labor. The continued rise in prices wa maintained during May, though not to such a marked extent as during the preceding month. The department's index number, which went up more than a point during April, reached the highest point in the record of the department during May, when it stood at 135.9, as compared with 135.4 in April and 126.1 in May a year ago.
