## WHAT, RUPERT TAXING BIBLES!

What looks at first sight like a tax on Bibles has been imposed by the City Council of Prince Rupert. The aldermen, especially Alderman Montgomery, cannot see their way to exempt two young colporteurs and Bible sellers from the \$50 license fee leviable upon traveling vendors of books in Prince Rupert. There is no doubt that the action of the Council will be reported outside by the young men who are affected by it, and the chances are that the impression will go abroad that Prince Rupert is a dreadful city where the terrible sanhedrin of the city council bans the sale of Bibles by an iniquitous tax. There arises the question of how many Bibles might have been sold anyway in Rupert, and how many books of less sacred character. The chances are that if the colporteurs had been carrying only Bibles they might have easily been excused the tax. There is no import duty on Bibles at the port of Prince Rupert. Dear knows some of us need them bad enough when linotypes are raging for "copy" and the head printer looks grim, or when the gasoline engine says "whoof!" and quits, while the machine man says other things and gets busy. No, no; it's not the Bibles Prince Rupert would tax.

## REGINA UNDAUNTED.

Already in Regina wholesale houses and other places of business are beginning to rebuild after the disaster of Sunday last. No time is lost by civic and business interests in idle bemoaning.

All honor to the undaunted determination of Regina's citizens. The spirit of it is summed up in the following sentence from the Regina Leader—in type before the city's tragedy was twelve hours old:

## STILL THE GREAT BOGEY GROWS.

Cost of living still soars, according to the latest estimate of the Department of Labor. The continued rise in prices was maintained during May, though not to such a marked extent as during the preceding month. The department's index number, which went up more than a point during April, reached the highest point in the record of the department during May, when it stood at 135.9, as compared with 135.4 in April and 126.1 in May a year ago. This rise of nearly 10 points in one year constitutes a record in the history of the department, and it is a noticeable feature that during the last year the lowest point was recorded during May and June, while the figures for May this year show an advance over those of any previous month.

## FIRST WHIPPET RACES EVER HELD IN BRITISH COLUMBIA

Something of an unusual interest at the Vancouver exhibition, which opens on August 10, will be the whippet races, which have never before been held in public in British Columbia.

A whippet is a breed of dog that is a cross between a greyhound and a terrier, and really looks to be a miniature greyhound, although a distinct breed of dog. These animals can travel at great speed, and for a short length of time could make the fastest race horse look as if it were standing. Its average time for a two hundred yard dash is a little under nine seconds, which would make its speed for a mile a trifle over a minute.

During the fair each day there will be two races, with at least four entries in each race, which will be enough to make it really interesting. This is the estimate now, but there are other entries expected before the beginning of August. A number of entries are coming from California and one string of eight dogs has been entered from Oregon. Individual animals are also owned by residents of Nanaimo and Victoria.

In England whippet races are common in the northern countries, especially in the mining districts, where they are usually run after a hare. The race at Vancouver will be run to a flag at different distances.

## WHAT IS YOUR WEIGHT?

Modern Woodmen Society Has a Standard in Selecting Risks.

A table now in use by the Modern Woodmen of America gives a table of proportionate height, weight and chest measurement, to be accepted as a standard in making selections for insurance. Those 20 per cent. above or below standard weight are adversely reviewed by the society's medical department.

According to the standard adopted candidates standing 5 feet 4 inches in height should weigh 120 pounds; 5 feet 2 inches, 125; 5 feet 3 inches, 130; 5 feet 4 inches, 135; 5 feet 5 inches, 140; 5 feet 6 inches, 143; 5 feet 7 inches, 145; 5 feet 8 inches, 148; 5 feet 9 inches, 155; 5 feet 10 inches, 160; 5 feet 11 inches, 165; 6 feet, 170 pounds.

## IMPORTANT CONGRESS OF HEALTH WORK

Washington, July 12. — Canada is now to have a prominent part in the Fifteenth International Congress on Hygiene and Washington September 23-28. The officers of the congress have just received word from James White, secretary of the Commission of Conservation at Ottawa, of which Hon. Clifford Sifton is chairman, stating that the commission would be represented at the congress.

In the same mail notification was received from J. D. Page, medical superintendent of the Quebec Immigration Hospital, connected with the Canadian Department of the Interior, that Dr. Emile Nadeau of Quebec would be one of the representatives of the department.

Twenty-five foreign countries are to be represented at the big health gathering and delegates from every state in the Union have been named. There are to be about 5,000 delegates to the congress, making it the largest gathering of its kind ever held. The American railroads have just granted special rates from all points for the occasion. A fare and a half for the round trip has been named as the rate.
